Adverse drug reactions (ADRs) are common cause of morbidity and mortality in patients. To increase awareness about the ADRs and its reporting, Government of India has launched Pharmacovigilance Program of India (PvPI), a nationwide program. The Medical Council of India also requires all medical colleges to establish a college Pharmacovigilance committee.

A Pharmacovigilance committee at Government Medical College, Barmer, is constituted under the chairmanship of Principal & Controller, Govt. Medical College, Barmer. Composition of the committee is as under:
